

QUEENS PARK RANGERS 2:0 CHARLTON

ATT= 11.512

After the excitement of last weeks cup tie, QPR failed to reproduce the form that dispersed of West Ham so convincingly. Had it been the likes of Liverpool or Everton playing QPR today then they would have gone home with three easy points but luckily QPR were playing lowly Charlton who lived up to their position. bottom of the first division.

In a highly boring game in which neither team seemed fully awake, Rangers managed to take the lead. Maguire's 39th minute cross found Falco, dived bravely to head home.

After the break Charlton seemed a bit more lively and managed a couple of shots on target, both of wheich were well saved by Johns. Byrne brought a touch of much needed classwhen he came on as sub and deserved to score Rangers second goal when he knocked in Bannister's unselfish pass in the 74th minute.

So three points and for a change QPR took the chances that came their way, unlike most matches.

EVERTON 2:0 QUEENS PARK RANGERS

ATT = 24.724

Another bad performence from QPR but this time they were dully punished for their lack lusture performence. With groin strain victim Mark Falco rulled out Les Ferdinad was given a rare chance in the first team alongside leading scorer Gary Bannister.

Early on Bannister went close but Rangers failed to make any headway against a tired Everton Team. Everton took the lead shortly before half time when Paul Parker sliced Paul Powers corner into the goal attenping to volley it away. Despite the setback Rangers showed no urgency to get back in the game during the second half. The best chance fell to Allen who got clear and was unlucky to see his shot superbly saved by Southall.

Everton wrapped up their easiest three points of the season when Pointon drove home after Johns had punched out Watson's firm header.

QUEENS PARK RANGERS 1:1 LUTON (FAC 4) ATT= 15,856

In the week leading up to today's match, Tottenham had a £750,000 offer for goalkeeper David Seaman turned down. David, now back from injury said he was happy with QPR.

The match kicked off amid a great atomosphere. Could this be the year we reach Wembley? Injury hit QPR were forced to give a debut to 19 year old Danny Maddix in place of Alan Mcdonald. Mark Fleming, a new 18 year old professional was named as sub.

As expected, a low turn out was present with around 2200 Womble's fans forming part of the crowd. The first half was a crappy afair with Mark Falco's shot from the edge of the area which brought the best out of Beasent being the best chance of the half. A spectacular overhead kick from Martin Allen ended up in the seats of the away end:

During the second half only the skill of John Byrne keapt the game alive. First he shrugged aside one challenge to fire in a 30 yard volley that flashed past the post, then he hit a post, then he scored. After a goalmouth scramble, the ball bobbled to Byrne who hooked the ball into the net from 4 yards.

'A KICK UP THE R's'
It it superbly done

articles. IN NO WAY

THIS, THE OTHER QPR
FANZINE. We wish
them all the best
for the future and
with one of the
best fanzines arou-

nd it looks like a good one. Anyway, continuing with our investigation, 'WHEN SATURDAY COMES' and OFF THE BALL are just about the best two fanzines around. Both are well produced and look at the game in general with lots of humour to keep you amused. Arsenal have not one but four! (talk about extra!) The newest of the bunch 'ONE NIL DOWN, TWO ONE ONE UP'is glossy all the through and leaves all the rest standing for quality. The other three are all very funny, 'THE GOONER' had me in stiches! VOICE OF THE VALLEY and VALIANTS VIEWPOINT' (both Charlton) make excellent reading for the few fans they have, I think a return to The Valley is badly in need. 'FLOODLIGHT' (Colchester) and 'OUT OF COURT' (Bournemouth) are both rather thin on material but are only 20p and what can 20p buy these days? One decent thing you could do with it is buy 'HIBEES' (Hibs) Hilarious digs at Rangers including the song; its black ... its blue....its broken in two...Terry's leg... Terry's leg! 'THE ABSOLUTE GAME' covers the Scotish game in general. The good thing about this one is that its not all about Rangers or Celtic.

'BLUE PRINT' (Man City) is a new zine just out and if issue 7 is anything to go by 1t will soon rank along with the best. 16 A4 pages makes it good value for money at the 40p asking price. 'LEYTON ORIENTEAR' (ghess who) has been around quite a while now and is definately recommended. Another general zine is'Balls' (you wot?) is very funny and is very cheap as well. THE CHELSEA INDEPEND-ENT: is very good considering the subject matter and is only 20p so why not? Chesterfield's THE CROOKED SPIREITE' is a must for any fan and is one of the funniest around, for example, spot the pitch at Oxford' Bradford City's 'THE CITY GENT' is always nicely presented but lacks humour so non Bradford fans may find it boring. Without a doubt though Notts County's 'THE PIE' gives the best value for money out of all the fanzines. The present edition has 52 pages all for 30p. If it's laughs you want I suggest you take a look at EAGLE EYE (Crystal Palace) Don't let the crappy cover mislead you. Perhaps on a more serious note. WBA's 'FINGERPOST' is very boring but is professionally produced and is the nearest thing resembling a proper magazine. Another new mag out is Millwall's 'THE LION ROARS', an excellent magazine that at long last gives Millwall fans their chance to air their views. Birmingham's appropriately named TIRED AND WEARY' and Sunderland's 'WISE MEN SAY' are both rather thin but are well presented. And finally we come to the new releases. 'THE NORTHEN LIGHT' (Aberdeen).'MURPHY's MOB' (Cheltenham Town) , 'THE COPPICE' (Spurs) and Falkirk's 'THE FALKIRK UNOFFICIAL MAGAZINE'. All of these will be reviewed in future editions of 'IN THE LOFT'. Please note; any fanzines not mentioned in this brief review, I have not seen yet so if the editors of the unmentioned fanzines would send them along to us we will review them.



FAREWELL FENWICK

As I watched the final tense minutes of the Q.P.R v Oxford match, an era was coming to an end. Terry Venables, the man who got Rangers to an F.A.Cup final, the man who got Rangers back into the first division and the man who took us into Europe was now taking our Terry from us. Terry Fenwick, one of the best players to embrace the famous blue and white hoops of Queens Park Rangers in recent years is leaving.

The day before, Tottenham Hotspur had offered a reported £500,000 for the services of Fenwick. The question was, would Fenwick go? No doubt, with the booing of Fenwick each time he touched the ball during
his last match, he was all set to sign for Venables,

the man Fenwick greatly admired.
I thought the booing was more in anger than anything else. The way in which Fenwick kept us all waiting for a decision over whether or not to except a new contrack worth to be £2000 a week. No player Maradona or live Walker is worth that

sort of money, so why Fenwick?

David Bulsrode stated that it was the best contract ever to be offered to a QPR player which made it seem likely from the day Terry failed to give a positive answer to this offer that he was destined to leave QPR. So why did Fenwick want to leave? After he led QPR in the rather forgetable Milk cup final of 86, Fenwick acheived the high point of his career, playing for England in the world cup finals. Unfortunately, Terry missed the opening part of last season through injury but he returned, refusing to play in

midfield and was instantly dropped. OK, so it never took him long to regain his place at centre back but this must have been the turning point for him wanting to leave QPR. 
With a couple of players looking decisively unfit, notably messrs Ferdinad and Kerslake, Seattle equalised again through Craig Beeson (I think?)
